Advent

Advent is a special time of year when we meditate on the Word of God given to us by the Church and renew our hope for the glorious coming of our Saviour.

We are called to prepare the way for the Lord – not the physical path, but that of our heart. It is a time for our conversion, cleansing of sins, getting rid of pride and selfishness, fixing our relationships with our neighbours and our families.

We have to make our own lives a straight path to God, a path without potholes and compromises. These tasks are not only for this year's Advent, but every Advent well lived better prepares us for the Saviour's coming. This extraordinary period speaks of salvation that comes to man from God.

ADVENT RETREAT (in Polish) will begin on **Sunday, December 8th** and will be led by Fr. Arkadiusz Cichla OMI, a Missionary from Ukraine. A detailed schedule will be announced next Sunday.

Fr. Arkadiusz Cichla OMI was born on July 12, 1972 in Wroclaw. On June 15, 2002, he was ordained in Wroclaw and received his first obedience to Ukraine. He worked in Yevpatoria (Crimea), Obukhiv, and Kiev, where he was also a pastor. He finished additional schooling in order to become a member of the formation team at the seminary. Currently, he is working in Obukhiv, where he is the superior. He is also the treasurer of the Ukranian Delegation.

Electronic Devices in the Church

The use of electronic devices (such as e-book readers, smartphones or tablets) during Mass is inappropriate and strictly prohibited. Holy Eucharist is a communal celebration and the use of such devices shut us off from that community and is distracting to others. However, electronic devices may be used outside of Mass (inside the church or Chapel of Perpetual Adoration) if they aid our private prayer, e.g. reading of the Holy Scriptures, litanies, meditations, etc. It is inappropriate to publicly point out to others that they use electronic devices for their personal prayer.
