

Baptism of the Lord



FR. PASTOR'S REFLECTION

Today the Catholic Church celebrates the Baptism of the Lord. This officially ends the season of Christmas, although in the Polish tradition carols are sung until February 2nd. Today's liturgical celebration is an opportunity for us to remember our baptism by which we were included in the community of the Church and became God's children.

Baptism is generally granted for the forgiveness of sins. In the case of Jesus who, as God, was without sin, it is an act of presenting Christ as the Son of God. The Father's voice is heard from heaven: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (Mt 3:17). This solemn moment also marks the beginning of Jesus' teaching mission. Christ was 30 years old then, which – according the Jews – was an age of maturity.

Our faith embraces the tension of the hypostatic union – the fully divine and fully human nature of Jesus. The Baptism of the Lord is a profound instance of the revelation of the humanity of Jesus and his desire to draw close to us.

John the Baptist baptized people "for repentance (Mt 3.11). If Jesus is God, why would he need to be baptized for the forgiveness of sins? One possible answer is that Jesus was baptized in order to identify totally with us. He is the only member of the human race that does not need forgiveness; however, in order to identify with us, he humbled himself to undergo baptism. He even identified with the effects of sin that we experience: suffering and death. I draw great comfort and hope from this episode in Matthew's Gospel; Jesus is present in every experience of my life, even in my need for redemption and forgiveness. His act of humility has increased my intimacy with him.

Each time we gather for Mass, we bless ourselves with water from the baptismal font, calling to mind our baptism and Christ's. Let this week's Eucharist be an opportunity to give thanks that we have a Saviour who understands our humanity and the effect that sin has on it, even as God the Father calls him "my Son, the Beloved."

100th Birthday of St. John Paul II
On **May 18th, 2020**, we will celebrate the **100th anniversary** of the birth of **Saint John Paul II.**



Our parish will mark the beginning of the celebrations with a solemn Mass on **February 2nd at 11 a.m.** The celebrant and homilist will be Fr. Alfred Grzempa OMI, Provincial of Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate. Closing celebrations will take place on the weekend of **May 30th and 31st, 2020.**

The Parish Council has prepared two events to mark John Paul II's 100th birthday. On **February 2nd and 9th**, our parish will host an exhibition entitled Eucharistic Miracles, which will show all Eucharistic miracles in the history of the Church. Another is the peregrination of the *Triptych of John Paul II*. Following in the footsteps of this Great Saint, we wish to entrust ourselves, our families, our parish, the Church and the entire world to the protection of the Mother of God.

Electronic Devices in the Church

The use of electronic devices (such as e-book readers, smartphones or tablets) during Mass is inappropriate and strictly prohibited. Holy Eucharist is a communal celebration and the use of such devices shut us off from that community and is distracting to others. However, electronic devices may be used outside of Mass (inside the church or Chapel of Perpetual Adoration) if they aid our private prayer, e.g. reading of the Holy Scriptures, litanies, meditations, etc. It is inappropriate to publicly point out to others that they use electronic devices for their personal prayer.
