2nd Sunday of Lent



Today's Gospel is one of great mystery: the Transfiguration. Moses and Elijah appear next to Jesus, who himself is completely transfigured, radiating pure light. Imagine vourself there...the sight must have been out of this world! In the face of all this glory, Peter's first reaction is to set up three dwellings, offering them worldly comfort. How often is God right in front of us, showing us his divinity and his plan for our life, and we focus on logistics and worldly preoccupations?

As a matter of fact, today during Mass, we will witness one of the greatest miracles of all time: bread and wine becoming Jesus' body and blood. The eucharist is the sacrament where we get a glimpse of God's glory and power. For a moment, heaven and earth meet. As we witness this miracle today, where will our heart and mind be? Will we be checking the time, or revelling in God's glory? Will we be thinking about the thing we need to do this week, or listening to God speak to our heart?

God's words to the disciples are a wake-up call: "Get up and do not be afraid." They prompt us to refocus on what's important: not worldly considerations, but an attentive ear and an open heart to his ever-living word, calling us to be examples of heaven here on earth.

SL ShareLife

On March 29th we begin an annual charity appeal in the Archdiocese of Toronto known as ShareLife. It is more than an annual campaign - it's a way to extend the hand of Christ to those in need. Each year, thousands of people turn to ShareLife agencies for help. These agencies provide services in an environment rooted in Catholic values and spread the Gospel message to those living in poverty. When we support ShareLife, we do more than give a donation; we show that the Catholic community is actively engaging in social services in our Archdiocese. As a family, are you able to contribute \$100 to ShareLife? Maybe as Lenten Almsgiving?

Euthanasia

The federal government has introduced new legislation expanding the eligibility criteria for euthanasia. There is no longer a requirement that the person receiving euthanasia be terminally ill. Under this legislation, any serious incurable illness, disease, or disability would render one eligible for euthanasia. This is a new chapter of death on demand. Canada has cast aside restrictions at a far quicker pace than any other jurisdiction in the world that has legalized euthanasia.

In his letter Cardinal Collins writes: "Under the proposed legislation, disabled Canadians with no terminal illness will now be eligible for lethal injection. People with disabilities already face substantial challenges relating to employment, housing, appropriate medical care and support. Their lives matter. They should never be seen as a burden to our society. We should be alarmed that those who have struggled for decades to be treated with equality may well be pressured, whether from family, friends or even their own health care professionals, to "ease their burden" and end their lives. These people need assisted living, not assisted death. I invite all Canadians concerned about this legislation to contact their Member of Parliament to voice their concerns."

Text Scam Targeting Parishioners

Please be aware of scammers who send text messages to parishioners pretending to be their parish pastor and ask them to purchase iTunes gift cards to help sick parishioners in the hospital. Similar email scams have taken place in the past. The scams appear to target parishioners who have phone numbers listed on the front of the bulletin or on a parish website. Please note that we never send such requests by phone, e-mail, or text message. If you are a target, we recommend that you contact the police to ensure they are aware of the situation.
