

Today's Gospel is the beginning of what is called Jesus' "farewell discourse" in John's Gospel. He is saying goodbye and the disciples are distressed. In response to their concern, Jesus makes some remarkable claims: that he will come back for them, that they already know the way to where he is going, that in seeing him they have seen the Father, and, finally, that they will do greater works than Jesus himself! On his last point, at least, we are often at one with the disciples. What could Jesus possibly mean? You and I are unlikely to walk on water.

Consider: Jesus healed dozens, maybe hundreds of people; the Gospels tell us he fed thousands upon thousands. And how many people have received medical attention from Christ's followers since his Ascension? How many have been fed? How may have had the good news preached to them? The answer should stun us, for it is both untold millions and not nearly enough.

In today's first reading, the resources of the early Church are challenged. The task of being Church to those in need is too big. In the face of that need, new gifts are discerned, called forth and blessed. And, as will happen again today at thousands of Masses around the world, people are fed and the gospel is preached. Let's not stop there.

# Praying at Home Spiritual Communion

Since we are still not allowed to celebrate Mass with the faithful, we encourage you to pray at home. The optimal solution would be to watch Mass live on TV or the Internet and receive Holy Communion spiritually. Spiritual communion consists of awakening in your heart an ardent desire to unite with Jesus; the grace received this way is the same as when we receive the Eucharist in the church.

# COVID-19 and Our Parish Sacraments:

- Eucharist we are back to our regular Mass schedule, except for the weekend evening Masses. Those intentions will be celebrated at a different time; appropriate individuals will be informed of the change by phone.
- **Reconciliation** none at this time, except in the event of a serious illness.
- **First Holy Communion** postponed until further notice.
- Confirmation postponed until further notice.
- Baptism may take place in the presence of the child, the child's parents, and Godparents.
- Marriage may take place in the presence of the couple and their two witnesses, provided the couple is able to obtain a valid marriage licence.

#### Other:

- Funeral prayers and interment take place at the cemetery. Maximum 10 people may attend. Funeral Mass can take place on or around the day of the funeral, with family and friends participating in it through our parish TV. Alternately, family may wish to wait with the funeral Mass and interment until the end of the pandemic.
- The **parish office** is closed but you may call during regular office hours.



MyParish App — our parish now has a mobile application. Install myParish App on your phone, select St. Maximilian Kolbe Parish, Mississauga, and stay up to date on all current events taking place at our parish. Important! In your phone settings remember to *Allow Notifications* in order to receive most up-to-date information, e.g. when public Mass will be celebrated again.
