In the Eucharist, we come forward to share in the life of God as we receive the body and blood of his Son, Jesus Christ. Let us pray that we will become what we eat: The Body of Christ. Nourished with this holy food, we will move with the force of the Holy Spirit and the fire of God's love to live as people of the Gospel.

100th Birthday of St. John Paul II



Saint John Paul II has always been present in the lives of many of us. If we belong to the younger generation, we were born when our compatriot was already on the throne of the Holy See. We didn't know what it was like not to have "our man" in the Vatican. But our parents remember well the moment when John Paul II was elected head of the Church and what an emotional day it was. There is no doubt that his pontificate had an enormous impact on the Catholic Church, on the fate of Poland, Europe and the world.

Who was Saint Pope John Paul II and why did we love him so much? We find the answer in the Gospel. On April 8, 2005, during his funeral, our eyes were filled with tears as we watched the Gospel lying on a plain oak casket, located in the center of the square in front of St. Peter's Basilica. Suddenly and to everyone's surprise, a gust of wind began to turn over the pages of the book. It looked as if an invisible hand was turning over the pages of the Gospels as if to say: "The answer is in the Gospel!" The life of St. John Paul II was a constant obedience to the Gospel of Jesus.

Remembering the words of St. John Paul II, who said: "Saints don't want our applause but for us to imitate them". we must ask ourselves: "What does the holiness of this extraordinary 20th century disciple of Jesus teach us?" Today we want to say to him: Thank you! And above all, tell him: We will try to follow in your footsteps on our path to Christ."

Initially we had planned many wonderful events for this special occasion, but now most of them will not take place. Memorial of St. Eugene de Mazenod Charles Joseph Eugène de Mazenod was born in France in 1782. Ordained in 1811, his religious experience led him to minister to the poor and the young. Interested in popular missions. Eugène founded a missionary institute of priests and lay brothers in 1826, the Oblates of Mary Immaculate. By the middle of the 19th century, in response to requests for help from North American bishops (...) the congregation sent several of its small number to Canada. Within 10 years of their arrival, the Oblates had covered all of Canada and expanded into the United States. Today, the members of this community work around the world in remote missions and in education. In Canada, Oblates established St. Paul University and Novalis, as well as numerous parishes and dioceses from coast to coast. Eugène de Mazenod was canonized on December 3, 1995 by Pope John Paul II.

COVID-19 and Our Parish Sacraments:

• Eucharist – we are back to our regular Mass schedule, except for the weekend evening Masses. Those intentions will be celebrated at a different time; appropriate individuals will be informed of the change by phone.

• Reconciliation – none at this time, except in the event of a serious illness.

• First Holy Communion - postponed until further notice.

• Confirmation – postponed until further notice.

• **Baptism** – may take place in the presence of the child, the child's parents, and Godparents.

• Marriage – may take place in the presence of the couple and their two witnesses, provided the couple is able to obtain a valid marriage licence.

Other:

• Funeral prayers and interment take place at the cemetery. Maximum 10 people may attend. Funeral Mass can take place on or around the day of the funeral, with family and friends participating in it through our parish TV. Alternately, family may wish to wait with the funeral Mass and interment until the end of the pandemic.

• The parish office is closed but you may call during regular office hours.

Heavenly Father, we place our trust in you, and pray for no more harm from coronavirus and for a quick end to the epidemic.

We ask you to restore health to the infected and peace to places touched by coronavirus. Receive those who have died of the disease, and comfort their families.

Support and protect the medical personnel fighting the virus; inspire and bless those trying to control the situation.

Lord Jesus, you are the doctor of our souls and bodies. We feel helpless in light of the pandemic but we place our trust in you and ask for peace and health.

Mother of God, protect us and look after us, and lead us through love to your Son Jesus Christ.
