COVID-19 and Our Parish

- As of Monday, March 15, 2021, churches in the Region of Peel are once again open at 15% capacity (250 individuals) and faithful can participate in Mass. Face masks are still mandatory inside all church buildings.
- Please listen carefully to parish announcements regarding registration for weekday and Sunday Mass. Seniors who do not have access to the Internet may call the parish office.
- All most up-to-date information is always communicated at the end of Mass. Please listen carefully.
- Weddings and funerals are restricted to 15% of the church capacity. Baptisms take place outside of Mass and are also restricted to 15% of church capacity.
- No meetings are taking place in parish halls or other church spaces at this time. The only exception are essential services, e.g., A.A.
- First Communion and Confirmation classes continue to take place virtually and will stay in this format for as long as the Region of Peel remains in a grey zone. If anything changes, we will inform all parents.
- When leaving a message on the parish answering machine, remember to include your name and phone number.
