**MISSIONARY ANIMATION** – Every year during summer time, the Archdiocese of Toronto is holding in its parishes a program called Missionary Animation. Stanislaw Oller, OMI from Madagascar during the weekend of 15/16 June.

Fr. Stanislaw was born in Chojnice, Poland. He was ordained in 1981. A year later, Fr. Stanislaw got his obedience to Madagascar. Presently, he works at Volobe, 60km west of Tamatave. There are currently sixty Christian communities totaling 4800 Catholics. It is a very vast mission, the furthest community from the central mission Volobe. Roads do not exist there at all, there are only trails.

**Second Apparition of Our Lady of Fatima – June 13<sup>th</sup>**

“MY IMMACULATE HEART WILL BE YOUR REFUGE AND THE WAY THAT WILL LEAD YOU TO GOD.”

June 13th, 1917

As soon as Jacinta, Francisco and I had finished praying the Rosary, with a number of other people who were present, we saw once more the flash reflecting the light which was approaching (which we called lightning.) The next moment, Our Lady was there on the holm oak, exactly the same as in May. “What do you want of me?” I asked. “I wish you to come here on the 13th of next month, to pray the Rosary every day, and to learn to read. Later, I will tell you what I want.” I asked for the cure of a sick person. “If he is converted, he will be cured during the year.” “I would like to ask you to take us to Heaven.” “Yes, I will take Jacinta and Francisco soon. But you are to stay here some time longer, Jesus wishes to make use of you to make me known and loved. He wants to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart.” “Am I to stay here alone?” I asked, sadly. “No, my daughter. Are you suffering a great deal? Do not lose heart. I will never forsake you. My Immaculate Heart will be your refuge and the way that will lead you to God.”

As Our Lady spoke these last words, she opened her hands and for the second time, she communicated to us the rays of that immense light. We saw ourselves in this light, as it were, immersed in God. Jacinta and Francisco seemed to be in that part of the light which rose towards Heaven, and I in that which was poured out on the earth. In front of the palm of Our Lady's right hand was a heart encircled by thorns which pierced it. We understood that this was the Immaculate Heart of Mary, outraged by the sins of humanity, and seeking reparation. You know now, Your Excellency, what we referred to when we said that Our Lady had revealed a secret to us in June. At the time, Our Lady did not tell us to keep it a secret, but we felt moved to do so by God.

Solemnity of Pentecost is one of the important days in the Christian liturgical year commemorating the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples of Christ. Pentecost is celebrated seven weeks (50 days) after Easter Sunday, hence its name. The Solemnity of Pentecost ends the Easter season.

Locked doors and locked hearts do not deter the Risen Christ. Literally and figuratively, the apostles were locked behind closed doors. They were locked in the upper room, fearful of the authorities. They were also locked inside their own fear, anger, guilt and grief...and Jesus broke through it all. He appeared suddenly in their midst and shared with them the first gifts of the Resurrection: forgiveness and peace. He commissioned them to share those gifts with others. He sent them out, as the Father had sent him. The peace of the Risen Lord, and all the gifts of his Spirit, would unlock the door of the upper room – and also unlock the disciples' hearts and lives. We see this in Acts, where the peace and joy they have received are communicated to others: Jews and non-Jews, strangers from many countries, people of many countries, and people of many languages. The gifts the apostles received were sharable – more than that, contagious – and they were available for everyone. Not just a select few. Everyone. The apostles spoke a universal language on Pentecost: the language of love, peace, forgiveness, hope... the story of God's mighty deeds... the call to discipleship, to a life of love and self-giving. This call could be heard and understood by everyone: a call into relationship, with Christ and with one another.
