

Long, lazy Yukon summer days offer kids a chance for imaginative play. They act out their favorite stories and recreate the exploits of their heroines and heroes. This play has a purpose. It provides our young with opportunity to prepare themselves for their futures. Every Sunday we are called on to reflect on our own futures through stories, parables and admonitions. We hear in the passage from the book of Wisdom, authored possibly as late as the first century, of a people enslaved in Egypt preparing for liberation. They trusted in the promises of God for "the deliverance of the righteous and the destruction of their enemies." Even before their release from bondage "already thy were singing the praises of ancestors." Do we? The letter to Hebrews reminds us of the lives of great women and men of the Old Testament. It shows us how their faith sustained them no matter what challenges they faced. Abraham continued to believe, even when asked to sacrifice his only son, Isaac. Have we developed such a wholehearted trust in God? Luke's parables of the alert slave and faithful manager call us to ready ourselves for any contingency. Where is our treasure? Where is our heart? These weekly passages and our daily actions at play or work continually prepare us to live God's word.

XXXVII WALKING PILGRIMAGE TO THE CANADIAN MARTYRS' SHRINE **IN MIDLAND** has reached its destination.

MIDLAND

The Martyrs' Shrine was built in 1926 to honour our eight Canadian Martyrs, and to carry on the spiritual work, for which the Jesuit Missionaries founded Sainte – Marie among the Hurons in 1639.

It was the principal residence for their Mission to the Hurons of Georgian Bay. The six priests all lived at Sainte Marie, and five of them were put to death in that area. At the request of the Canadian Bishop, His Holiness, Pope Pius XII, in 1940, named them secondary patrons of Canada.

SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY - Thursday, August 15th. On November 1, 1950, Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith. According to Roman Catholic doctrine and the traditions of the Roman Catholic Church, the Blessed Virgin Mary "having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed with body and soul into heavenly glory." This means that Mary was transported into Heaven with her body and soul united. Mary's passage into Heaven is called the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary by Roman Catholics.

On Monday, August 12th, Father Bogusław Nagiel of Kraków will be a guest in our parish. For 3 years now, Father Bogusław has been the National Chaplain for the Marguerite Apostolate in Poland. This is a movement of faithful praying for priests. The "Mouvement des Marguerites" (Daisies) was founded in Canada in 1981, by Professor Louise Ward, with the approbation of the local bishop. The first "Marguerites" were formed at that time. The Apostolate's mission is to pray for a specific priest, care for the unity of priests with their bishop, and with each other, and collaboration between priests and laypeople, as well as supporting vocations to the priesthood and religious life.
