## EUCCHARISTIC MIRACLES

### An Exhibition

An exhibition on Eucharistic Miracles can still be viewed in the parish hall this weekend. It was prepared to inaugurate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the birth of John Paul II. A sincere THANK YOU to Mrs. Dina Oanes from Brampton for setting up the exhibition.

### Brief History

The Church history notes over 130 miracles related to the Eucharist. They occur in times of doubt in the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, during attempts of desecration, but also as a reward for faith and love.

The first Eucharistic miracle is the transformation of the Host and wine into a piece of flesh and blood at the monastery of Lanciano in Italy in the eighth century. In the monastery of the Basilian Fathers, one of the priests was tormented by doubts about the presence of Jesus Christ in the form of bread and wine. He also had these doubts when he was celebrating Mass. Then, just as he was finishing the words of consecration, the host turned into a piece of human flesh and wine into human blood. The friar informed his confreres. Word spread throughout the city. A special reliquary was made in which the Body and Blood are kept until today. The blood turned into five lumps, but the body remained intact.

In 1970, the miraculous Eucharist was thoroughly examined. Researchers have stated that the Body is a fragment of a human heart, with no signs of preservation, and Blood has AB type.

On this beautiful occasion of the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the birth of Saint John Paul II it is worth learning more about the life and charism of this great Pope.
