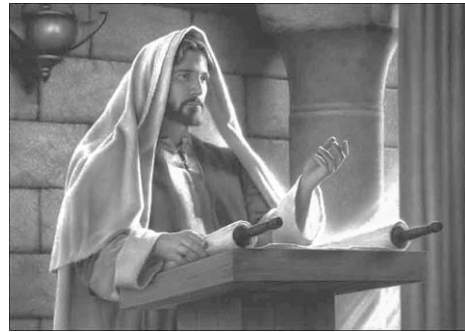


6th Sunday in Ordinary Time



In today's Gospel, Jesus warns us that he had not come to abolish the law, but to fulfill it.

Just because God loves us, does not mean he has to do what we want him to do. We can't manipulate God or guilt trip him into doing what we want. It's humbling for us to realize that we are not entitled to his favour. God chooses to help us with perfect freedom from a place of pure love. The law that he gave to us was not meant to limit us, but to ensure we use our freedom in a way that is good for us and others.

Love requires freedom, and freedom means we have to respect the other person's ability to say "no" to us. If we truly desire to be in a mature relationship with God, then we need to respect this freedom and ensure we use our freedom in a way that gives God glory, which will strengthen our relationship with God and others.

Today as we celebrate the Eucharist, a sacrifice made freely on our behalf, let us repent of the times we've trespassed against God and our neighbor, and embrace the gift of God's law and the true freedom it leads us to.

FR. PASTOR'S REFLECTION

In order to properly understand Jesus' message in today's Gospel, one needs to put themselves in the position of an Israelite of that time; a man who often experienced confusion in the religious aspect of his life. On the one hand, God chooses a nation by giving it a Law, which is about mission, dignity and responsibility. On the other hand, official scholars of the Law break it up into over 600 detailed regulations, difficult to remember, let alone to fulfill. Where to find Life in all of this? How to see the Light in this labyrinth of commands and prohibitions?

The teacher from Nazareth clarifies this confusion not only with wisdom but also with real power. "You have heard that it was said that... And I tell you..." With his proclamation of the kingdom and with his lifestyle Jesus presents change and newness. He returns to the Law and the prophets, declaring that they are necessary, wise and redemptive.

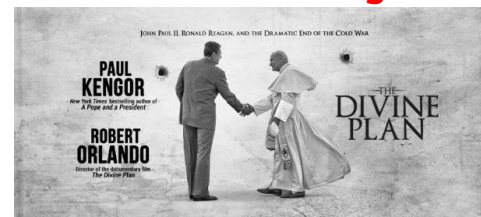
Retreat

Movie Screening



In the year of St. John Paul II, the Parish Council invites all parishioners to a screening of the movie *The Divine Plan*. This is a full-length documentary which analyzes the collaboration between Pope John Paul II and President Ronald Reagan, a collaboration that formed after assassination attempts on their lives. The film raises important question of whether their partnership at the end of the Cold War and the fall of Soviet communism was accidental or providential. Film director Robert Orlando interviews Church experts, politicians and public officials. The film also addresses the relations between the United States and the Catholic Church.
