

1st Sunday of Lent



It has been said that nothing in this world is certain except death and taxes. Surely temptation could be added as a third. Our lives are constantly fraught with urges and desires that we either succumb to or rebuff.

Having fasted for 40 days and 40 nights, Jesus was left in the most vulnerable of human conditions. Sensing weakness, Satan sprung into action and tried to tempt Jesus three times. On each occasion, the great deceiver was spurned by Jesus, who stubbornly obeyed the will of God. Denying God's will didn't even enter Jesus' mind as he chided Satan for his wilderness volleys. Jesus' resolve faced a much more vigorous test in Gethsemane when he asked God if the cup of his pending crucifixion might pass him by. Even then, Jesus overcame human frailty to submit to God's will.

As was the case with our own first parents in the Garden of Eden, we are offered freedom of choice and are constantly tested by temptation. Like Adam and Eve, our human infirmity renders us susceptible to Satan's seductions. As we begin Lent, let us use the traditional practices of fasting, prayer and almsgiving to provide us with the defence we need to fend off the advances of Satan. These practices, rooted in our belief in Jesus as our Redeemer, are the bulwarks of that resistance.

FR. PASTOR'S REFLECTION

Today is the First Sunday of Lent, a new period in the liturgical year indicated by the purple colour of liturgical vestments. It is a holy time of penance and transformation. Through prayer and meditation on the Passion of the Lord, we are also preparing for a fruitful experience of the joyful day of Christ's Resurrection. During Lent, the Precepts of the Catholic Church oblige us to refrain from participating in various forms of entertainment (e.g. parties) and command us to receive the sacraments of Easter Reconciliation and Holy Communion.

As we look upon the Crucified Savior, who has renounced everything and sacrificed his life for us, let us make an effort of voluntary penance as a restitution for our sins. Let's make meaningful resolutions and refrain from participating in extravagant pastimes (sometime intentionally organized for our children and youth), from drinking alcoholic beverages, and smoking cigarettes, in order to compensate God for our sins of drunkenness, promiscuity, foul language, dishonesty, and lack of humility.

In order to experience the holy time of Lent in a deep and meaningful way, our parish offers the following Passion Liturgies:

Lenten Lamentations
Sundays at 6:15 p.m. in Polish

Stations of the Cross
Mondays at 6:30 p.m. for children
Tuesdays at 6:30 p.m. in English
Fridays at 6:30 p.m. in Polish

Another suggestion is to engage in reading the **Bible** and deepen our faith through meditation on the **Word of God**. This can be done individually, as a family, or by joining a Bible Study Group.

Finally, let us embrace Lenten sobriety with more courage. The Church calls us to individual and community prayer for sobriety, so that there are no people and families among us who suffer from alcohol, smoking, and drug addictions. **A Book of Sobriety is placed beside the Altar of Relics.** Individuals and families are encouraged to sign their names as a pledge to take up abstinence during Lent.



Lenten Walk with the Lord 40 Acts of Kindness

Our parish is presenting an additional or optional way to enhance and enrich your Lenten commitment and experience. "Lenten Walk with the Lord" invites you to do one simple act of kindness for each of the 40 days of Lent. There is a calendar, included in the parish bulletin, which will help you keep track of your kindnesses along with some simple instructions. For example, kindness can be as simple as a smile and often begins at home.



Kolbe Pro-Life Group invites all parishioners to join 40 Days for Life – a global prayer campaign to defend the lives of unborn children. **In our parish, this campaign takes the form of silent prayer in the Chapel of Perpetual Adoration and runs for the entire period of Lent, starting on Ash Wednesday.** In Canada, over 100,000 abortions are performed annually and ours is one of three countries with absolutely no regulations protecting the unborn life; abortion on demand is possible until delivery. Join us in praying to save the lives of unborn children. **All that is needed is an hour of your time.**
