3rd Sunday of Easter



The two disciples in our Gospel today are walking from Jerusalem towards Emmaus. They try to put behind them the place where Jesus suffered and was crucified. Their understanding is clouded by sadness and confusion and they cannot accept the joy of the resurrection.

The loss of a loved one causes deep pain in our hearts. Despite the knowledge of the resurrection, we would rather have our loved one's presence on earth. We want to run from pain instead of experiencing it. However, the Gospel reminds us of the gift of the Eucharist. When they break bread with Jesus, the disciples see beyond their grief, allowing their hears and minds to be open to the events of the resurrection. This gives them the courage to return to Jerusalem.

As Catholics we can connect to the experience of the disciples. It is often at Mass, in the presence of the Eucharist, that we come to comprehend the truths deep in our hearts. We are reminded that our suffering brings us closer to Christ our Saviour and we are given the space to reflect on our action and thoughts. The breaking of bread leads to personal reflection, so we can stop walking away from pain and instead embrace our human experience. In the presence of Jesus our hearts burn with love, understanding and hope.

FR. PASTOR'S REFLECTION

During the epidemic, we are reminded of an old truth that in times of difficulty we need God differently than usual, we seek Him more intensely. This image of God, which is ingrained in us, requires a change in the way of thinking. We must realize that God accompanies us all the time, comes whenever we need Him, and permeates our every thought and desire. He wants what's good for us, even if we cannot fully understand it.

We are experiencing the Easter season like never before. However, we should trust that Jesus is coming "although the doors [are] locked" - literally and figuratively. He comes to our homes - in which we have been separated from the outside world for over a month – to soothe our anxiety, ease our pain, and give us confidence in times of uncertainty. Jesus brings us strength that will allow us to rise not only from the situation caused by the epidemic, but also from our personal tribulations.

Praying at Home Spiritual Communion

Currently, we are still not allowed to open our churches and celebrate Mass with the faithful. However, we encourage you to pray individually at home. The optimal solution would be to watch Mass live on TV or the Internet and receive Holy Communion spiritually. How is Spiritual Communion received? Spiritual communion consists of awakening in your heart an ardent desire to unite with Jesus; the grace received this way is the same as when we receive the Eucharist in the church.

In your phone settings remember to Allow Notifications in order to receive most up-to-date information, e.g. when public Mass will be celebrated again.

If you are an elderly person and can't or shouldn't leave the house, call the parish office and our parish youth will do your grocery shopping for you.

COVID-19 and Our Parish

The Government of Ontario has extended the state of emergency in our province by another 28 days. All current restrictions remain in place: churches, schools, shopping malls, and most stores are expected to be closed until mid-May. Under these circumstances, and as was the case with Confirmation, First Holy Communion will certainly be postponed until after the end of the pandemic. As of today, no one knows for certain when it will take place.

Reminders:

• The church is closed until further notice! The Government of Ontario makes it clear that churches as public meeting places must remain closed.

• Priests continue to celebrate Mass but without the physical presence and participation of the faithful. Cardinal Collins granted all faithful dispensation from attending church on Sunday and days of obligation. This means that we do not commit a grave sin if we don't attend Sunday Mass.

• We encourage you to participate in Mass that is being broadcast live from our church. We are back to our regular Mass schedule, except for the weekend evening Masses. Those intentions will be celebrated at a different time; appropriate individuals will be informed of the change by phone.

• There is currently no confession, except in the event of a serious illness. Confessions with the presence of many priests will take place once restrictions are lifted and all activities return to normal.

• The **parish office is closed** but you may call during regular office hours.

• Sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation are postponed until the end of the pandemic.

• Sacrament of **Baptism** may take in the presence of the child, the child's parents, and Godparents. The sacrament of Marriage can take place in the presence of the couple and their two witnesses. All other guests should participate virtually.

• Funeral prayers and interment take place at the cemetery. Maximum 10 people may attend. Funeral Mass can take place on or around the day of the funeral, with family and friends participating in it through our parish TV. Alternately, family may wish to wait with the funeral Mass and interment until the end of the pandemic.

We are very grateful to our parishioners who regularly bring their Sunday collection and deposit it into a secure box found by entrance to the parish office. Just over half of our parishioners feel responsible for their parish and regularly bring their Sunday collection. The parish must function despite the crisis and continue to pay expenses on regular basis.
