# Pentecost Sunday



Our God is a God of Contradiction. In fact, it is in these contradictions that we learn peace, a fruit of the Spirit.

In today's readings we hear two accounts of the Holy Spirit that are radically opposed. In Acts, the Spirit comes to the Apostles like a mighty wind and a shower of flame. It is unexpected and frightening. It is incomprehensible to bystanders.

In the Gospel of John, Jesus comes to the disciples and breathes the Spirit onto them in person. Jesus is flesh and blood, and familiar to them. He wishes them peace.

These two narratives illustrate the Holy Spirit as being at once frightening and comforting, mysterious and familiar, transcendent and immanent. This is just as it should be, because the Spirit of peace is all of these things despite apparent contradiction.

Peace, a grace given and a virtue pursued, flows from knowing the spirit of God, God the creator of all. He is maker of fire, of venomous spiders, and of all clawed and toothed beasts inasmuch as he is the creator of the sun and the moon and the laughter of children.

To be at peace is to rest in this, which we cannot understand and which might even frighten us. It is to trust in the Lord who is mighty and mysterious, but who is good.

### FR. PASTOR'S REFLECTION

The liturgy of today's Solemnity of Pentecost invites us to listen to the "noise like a strong driving wind" of the Holy Spirit's power. It is a breath of His Peaceful Love. We are also invited to accept Him into our hearts and our lives, meet Him just as the Apostles did after His resurrection, and repeat with conviction the words of Thomas: "My Lord and my God."

The events described in the Gospel, however, cannot remain simply beautiful stories. They're not just accounts of past events. They are accounts of God's true presence, His relationship with His people, and His work among them If we carefully follow what Jesus said to those He met after His resurrection, we will notice that His were most often words of consolation, words of assurance of His continued presence, words full of comfort and hope.

### COVID-19 and Our Parish Sacraments:

- Eucharist we are back to our regular Mass schedule, except for the weekend evening Masses. Those intentions will be celebrated at a different time; appropriate individuals will be informed of the change by phone.
- **Reconciliation** none at this time, except in the event of a serious illness.
- First Holy Communion postponed until further notice.
- **Confirmation** postponed until further notice.
- **Baptism** may take place in the presence of the child, the child's parents, and Godparents.
- Marriage may take place in the presence of the couple and their two witnesses, provided the couple is able to obtain a valid marriage licence.

### Other:

- Funeral prayers and interment take place at the cemetery. Maximum 10 people may attend. Funeral Mass can take place on or around the day of the funeral, with family and friends participating in it through our parish TV. Alternately, family may wish to wait with the funeral Mass and interment until the end of the pandemic.
