Do I look at the world with that same desire and faith in the power of God's word? Do I see neighbour, stranger, the familiar and the distinct, as places where this seed might well thrive? As people who strive to understand with the heart, we have no idea in which places the word and its beauty will take hold. May the word take hold wildly and freely in this fractured world so that something extraordinary blooms...by grace, rather than logic or probability.

An update from Canadian Martyrs' Shrine in Midland

It has been decided that Martyrs' Shrine will not be opening its Church, or its Grounds, until 1 May 2021. Instead, efforts and resources, this season, will be focused on providing prayer, pastoral care, and ministry, through new digital mediums on our website. This decision represents the first time, in Martyrs' Shrine's nearly 100-year history, that it has not been open to pilgrims, and is a temporary measure representative of the magnitude of the global pandemic.

It is our belief that the scope of prayers made through the intercession of St. Jean de Brébeuf and his companions reach far beyond the gates of Martyrs' Shrine. Though pilgrims will not be able to be physically on-site, we will ensure they can remain connected to Martyrs' Shrine in other ways. The Jesuit Fathers who serve the apostolate are increasing their Ministry of Prayer by accepting petitions, requests, and Mass intentions, to be prayed for next to the relics of our Martyrs, through our website, and will continue to serve in a variety of out-reach ministries throughout the Archdiocese of Toronto and beyond.

Together, we pray for the healing of our world, and all who have been affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Church Opening Protocol

- A Summary -

Our church is open and the faithful can begin to participate in Mass. As always, social distance must be observed. **Inside the church, only seats marked with yellow tape may be occupied.** Please note that occupancy of the church building is significantly reduced. The maximum capacity is as follows: main church – 90; choir loft – 65; hallway – 35; parish hall – 110.

During the pandemic, in all churches in Ontario and in Canada, **Holy Communion** can only be received on the hand. There are absolutely no exceptions in this respect. Also, there will be no music in the church for the next few weeks. The organist will play, but there must be **no singing**. Parish bulletins will also not be printed; they will only be available online.

Sacraments:

- Eucharist we are back to our regular Mass schedule.
- Reconciliation Monday to Friday, from 6 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. in the Good Shepherd Catechetical Centre. Face masks are mandatory during confession.
- First Holy Communion please call the parish office if you would like your child to receive their First Holy Communion on a weekday or on Saturday. When and if we receive permission from the Archbishop, we hope to have all other children receive First Holy Communion in September.
- Confirmation postponed until further notice.
- **Baptisms** take place outside of Mass on Saturdays.
- Marriage may take place in the church as long as social distancing is observed.

Other:

- Funeral Mass can be celebrated in the church in the presence of family and friends. Internment follows at a cemetery.
- The **Chapel of Perpetual Adoration** is open. Maximum 6 people can be present in the chapel.
- The **parish office** is closed but you may call during regular office hours.
- Face masks are now mandatory inside contained public spaces.
- Dispensation from physical participation in Mass in the church is still in effect. However, we are still obliged to participate in Sunday Mass through the media. If you feel sick or weak, if you have a fever or cough you should not come to church at this time. It is understandable that not everyone will be able to come to church because of the limited space. Mass is still being livestreamed online.

Groceries for Homebound Seniors

If you are an elderly person and can't or shouldn't leave the house, call the parish office and our parish youth will do your grocery shopping for you.

Sunday Collection

• At the present time, Sunday Offering cannot be collected in a traditional way. However, it will be collected at the end of Mass by members of the Church Committee, who will stand by the exit door of the church and the parish hall. • A secure collection box can also be found by the parish office. • Alternately, donations can be made online at www.kolbe.ca by clicking on Donate Now and choosing St. Maximilian Kolbe Church from the list of parishes. • If you're supporting our Building and Renovation Fund, please place your offertory envelope in the collection basket by the exit door.
