16th Sunday in Ordinary Time



One of the great laments of the psalms is, "O Lord, why do the wicked prosper?" All people - like children at play - have an instinctive desire for justice. And when we see injustice or wickedness seemingly rewarded by prosperity, we begin to question God's oversight of the world.

In response to this concern, there are two good reflections in today's Gospel parable of the weeds and the wheat. First, we may not understand why somebody sows weeds among the wheat, but we do experience the reality of the two growing together. Thus, the parable invites us to trust that God's justice, despite what we see, will ultimately be exercised. Meanwhile, there is something important about the wheat good people – accepting the presence of the weeds and continuing to be faithful to being good despite the weeds.

Then, a second thought arises. Do we not all have within us both wheat and weeds? Why do they grow together within us? And what will happen to our weeds? Such a thought, I would hope, should help us not to judge others whom we easily demonize as "weeds," while overlooking our own faults. Perhaps we also need to accommodate ourselves, without giving in, to our own weeds. For the concluding phrase of the first reading gives us God's answer, filled with hope: "...because you [God] give repentance for sins."

New By-Law Requires Mandatory Use of Masks at Church

As you may have heard in recent days, a new by-law has been passed that makes the use of masks or face coverings inside all public places mandatory. This includes places of worship, so our own church and Chapel of Perpetual Adoration. We ask that all those coming to church bring a mask or face covering and wear it upon entering the church.

We recognize that this may be an inconvenience, vet we know that we are all committed to caring for our neighbour and those around us. While a number of restrictions have been lifted in recent days, we are still in the middle of a pandemic and need to take the appropriate steps to minimize any potential spread of Covid-19. So while the Archdiocese of Toronto had highly recommended wearing a mask while in church and I know that most of you have been doing so, it is now a by-law that must be followed.

The Jesuit Fathers who serve the apostolate are increasing their Ministry of Prayer by accepting petitions, requests, and Mass intentions, to be prayed for next to the relics of our Martyrs, through our website, and will continue to serve in a variety of out-reach ministries throughout the Archdiocese of Toronto and beyond.

Church Opening Protocol - A Summary -

Our church is open and the faithful can begin to participate in Mass. As always, social distance must be observed. Inside the church. only seats marked with vellow tape may be occupied. Please note that occupancy of the church building is significantly reduced. The maximum capacity is as follows: main church – 90; choir loft – 65; hallway – 35; parish hall - 110.

During the pandemic, in all churches in Ontario and in Canada, Holy Communion can only be received on the hand. There are absolutely no exceptions in this respect. Also, there will be no music in the church for the next few weeks. The organist will play, but there must be **no singing**. Parish bulletins will also not be printed: they will only be available online.

Sacraments:

• Eucharist – we are back to our regular Mass schedule.

- Reconciliation Monday to Friday, from 6 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. in the Good Shepherd Catechetical Centre. Face masks are mandatory during confession.
- First Holy Communion please call the parish office if you would like your child to receive their First Holy Communion on a weekday or on Saturday. When and if we receive permission from the Archbishop, we hope to have all other children receive First Holy Communion in September.
- Confirmation postponed until further notice.

• Baptisms – take place outside of Mass on Saturdays.

• Marriage – may take place in the church as long as social distancing is observed.

Other:

• Funeral Mass can be celebrated in the church in the presence of family and friends. Internment follows at a cemetery.

• The Chapel of Perpetual Adoration is open. Maximum 6 people can be present in the chapel.

• The **parish office** is closed but you may call during regular office hours.

• Face masks are now mandatory inside contained public spaces.

• Dispensation from physical participation in Mass in the church is still in effect. However, we are still obliged to participate in Sunday Mass through the media. If you feel sick or weak, if you have a fever or cough you should not come to church at this time. It is understandable that not everyone will be able to come to church because of the limited space. Mass is still being livestreamed online.
