2nd Sunday of Lent



Today's first reading is one of the most important religious texts ever written. While it is stranger for us to read of a god asking for human sacrifice, that was nothing out of the ordinary in Abraham's world. The bewilderment we feel reading this passage is, in fact, a result of the text's own success. It is because of the story of Abraham and Isaac that human and child sacrifice looks the way it does to us.

Human sacrifice is not some aberration in human history. In one way or another, it is the norm. The other gods humans have worshipped, whether they go by ancient names like Baal and Moloch, or modern names like Choice and National Security, have always demanded what is most precious, our sons and daughters. It is only the God of Abraham who does not demand but provides the sacrifice.

The story of Abraham and Isaac begins the trajectory that ends with Christ. When Paul tells the Romans that God "did not withhold his own Son," he is linking Jesus and Isaac and pointing us towards the inversion of sacrifice that Isaac presaged, and Jesus fulfilled.

This inversion transfigures human history. What could this rising from the dead mean? That the one who gave himself to be sacrificed so that we might see the truth about human sacrifice was God's own Son.

This must be done one year prior to the anticipated date of the wedding. In addition, marriage preparation course is mandatory for all couples intending to be married in the Roman Catholic Church.

Important Reminders

• Please do not use envelopes from 2020 or from previous years. If you wish to us them, you must write your name and address on the envelope.

• Offertory envelopes for 2021 are available for pick-up in the parish hall. Those who still wish to receive a set of offertory envelopes are asked to contact the parish office.

• All donations made for parish upkeep, renovations, retreats, and any Archdiocese of Toronto collections are tax deductible. This does not apply to offerings made for Mass intentions.

Recognizing the health and safety measures announced by the Province of Ontario on November 20, 2020, Cardinal Thomas Collins directed parishes to implement the following in the Toronto and Peel regions:

• All public Masses are temporarily cancelled. All Masses are celebrated privately by the parish priests and the faithful are encouraged to take part in Mass through the parish TV.

• Parishes throughout the region of Peel must restrict attendance inside the church building to 10 people. Our church is open for private prayer and the hours are posted on the church door. As you enter the church foyer, you'll notice a binder with a large number indicating the number of people presently in the church. If the number is less than 10, turn the page and go in. If the number is already at 10, please wait for someone to leave the church. As you leave the church, turn the page back. This way we'll be able to keep track of the number of individuals inside the church building. Thank you for your cooperation.

• Weddings and funerals are restricted to 10 persons, including those who are involved in ministry. Baptisms take place outside of Mass and are also restricted to 10 persons.

• No meetings should take place in parish halls or other church spaces at this time. The only exception would be those deemed as essential services.
