



Reflection

The readings today are a reminder of who we are and whose we are. God answers Job after Job's struggle to understand why tragedy has come into his life. Paul's letter reminds us that God is still active, re-creating us and the world around us. Mark's Gospel shows us disciples who are frightened by the weather: their boat that appears sturdy and capable when the waters are calm now appears so tiny and vulnerable. Once the disciples waken him, Jesus calms the storm and asks why they are afraid. In all these readings, we have very strong images that speak to us of trust and peace.

We find ourselves often getting swept up in the storms of life and this can be overwhelming. We can relate to Job and the disciples – we struggle with trusting God and we easily get anxious. We wonder where God is as we face challenging circumstances.

"Peace! Be still!" Jesus is inviting us to trust him fully. Though we may be feeling uncertain or scared, God is letting us know God's faithfulness is stronger than what we are feeling in any given moment. We are to trust God's perspective rather than our own.

We always want to know why things are happening. Instead, let us ask God how these circumstances can help us grow in holiness.

COVID-19 and Our Parish

On June 7th, the provincial government announced revisions to the "Roadmap for Reopening" as they relate to places of worship. The updated measures resulted in places of worship opening at 15% capacity in Step 1, and will increase to 25% capacity in Step 2. What does it mean for our parish?

15% capacity = 255 people in our church

- **Livestreaming** of services and dispensation from the Sunday Eucharist continues. The elderly, those with compromised immune systems or other health conditions should be encouraged to exercise extreme caution about any outings, including attendance at church.

- Please do not congregate in large numbers in or around the church before or after services.

- **Funerals** take place from Monday to Friday in the morning. Families wishing to use funeral home services must limit capacity to 50 people.

- **Baptisms** take place outside of Mass, on Saturday mornings.

- **Weddings** are celebrated with Mass; maximum number of guests is 255.

- No **meetings** are taking place in parish halls or other church spaces at this time. The only exception are essential services, e.g., A.A. These gatherings should be restricted to 10 people and ensure that all appropriate health and safety measures are in place.

- All **most up-to-date information** is always communicated at the end of Mass. Please listen carefully.

- When leaving a message on the parish answering machine, remember to include your name and phone number.

- As always, all appropriate health and safety measures are in place (use of masks, hand sanitizer, physical distancing, etc.).

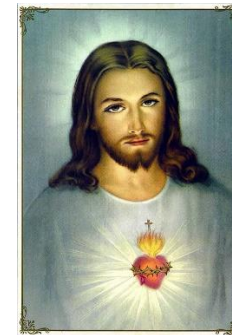
Parish office is still closed to the public, but you may always call and leave a message. Remember to include your name and phone number.
