Reflection

Can you imagine going on the most important journey of your life and being told to bring no money? This was the very thing the twelve disciples were commissioned to do by Jesus. Nevertheless, the twelve understood that humility leads to a greater inheritance, where eternal salvation and redemption through Christ are received.

Jesus and his disciples understood that this task was counter to how society operates. Today, leaving behind our possessions to do Christ's work feels impossible. Consumerism and our attachment to possessions overwhelm our day-to-day lives. Yet the need to have the newest and the best brings out the least humble aspects of our personalities and prevents us from following in Christ's footsteps. For example, the desire to achieve the status rooted in obtaining physical items may drive us to lose our patience with retail associates, or other people while stuck in traffic.

Our faith calls us to be better. We received the light of Christ at our baptism and are called to spread that light with all we meet. This cannot be done if our hearts are focused on the instant gratification found in earthly commodities. We know that our true inheritance is found in the promise of eternal life with our Saviour and that this is worth more than anything money can buy.

COVID-19 and Our Parish

We are happy to announce that our church is once again open for in-person celebrations, but we are allowed to operate at 25% capacity, i.e., 550 people in both the church and the parish hall. Although registration is no longer required, volunteers will be counting people at the door to make sure we do not exceed the allowed capacity.

All Masses are held indoors, except for the 11 o'clock high Mass on Sunday, which is celebrated on the church parking lot, with no limit of people in attendance. If you are coming for the 11 a.m. Mass on Sunday, please park near the Rosary Garden.

• Livestreaming of services and dispensation from physical participation in the Sunday Eucharist continues. The elderly, those with compromised immune systems or other health conditions should be encouraged to exercise extreme caution about any outings, including attendance at church.

• Please do not congregate in large numbers in or around the church before or after services.

• Funerals take place from Monday to Friday in the morning.

• Baptisms take place outside of Mass, on Saturday mornings.

• Weddings are celebrated with Mass; maximum number of guests is about 500.

• No meetings are taking place in parish halls or other church spaces at this time. The only exception are essential services, e.g., A.A. These gatherings should be restricted to 10 people and ensure that all appropriate health and safety measures are in place.

• All most up-to-date information is always communicated at the end of Mass. Please listen carefully.

• When leaving a message on the parish answering machine, remember to include your name and phone number.

• As always, all appropriate health and safety measures are in place (use of masks, hand sanitizer, physical distancing, etc.).
