
23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time



Reflection

Those who have faith and have the heart of a child are humble and ready to be in awe of God's wonder. They expect miracles. And Jesus' healing love brings them much joy.

Today's Gospel recalls a story of a deaf man being brought to Jesus by other people. They must have heard and seen Jesus performing signs and wonders. It is not their duty, but they beg Jesus to pray for this man. Such love of neighbor welling up makes them forget themselves and be concerned for others' good.

These people had child-like faith; and Jesus, Son of the Most High God, modelled being a child of God. He had all the power to heal but he did it in union with God the Father and the Holy Spirit. He looked up to heaven, thanking the Father for his love; with the Holy Spirit he healed with compassion; and he who is the Word spoke Life over the man.

Jesus invites us to stay rooted in God's love and then share what we have received with other people. Through his merciful heart and by our caring for others – with words, deeds, and prayers - healing and miracles happen. And the first miracle would be genuine joy and real hope in our very own hearts.

Confession

Sacrament of reconciliation is available 30 minutes before each Mass. Face masks are mandatory.

Sacrament of Baptism

Parents who are registered members of St. Maximilian Kolbe Church and would like to baptize their child must contact the parish office at least 6 weeks before the anticipated date of baptism. Nowadays, baptisms take place on Saturday mornings, outside of Mass.

Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to be married at St. Maximilian Kolbe Roman Catholic Church must contact the parish office at least one year prior to the anticipated date of the wedding in order to open a wedding file and obtain a list of required documents. In addition, marriage preparation course is mandatory for all couples intending to be married in the Roman Catholic Church. Please keep in mind that our priests can only marry those who are registered members of our parish and reside within the geographical boundaries of the Archdiocese of Toronto.

COVID-19 and Our Parish

Please note that a hospital chaplain – a Roman We are happy to announce that our church is once again open for in-person celebrations. All Masses are held indoors.

- For sacramental celebrations, in Step 3, there is no capacity limit for places of worship. However, physical distancing of 2 metres is still required between parishioners attending Mass who are not from the same household.
- Livestreaming of services and dispensation from physical participation in the Sunday Eucharist continues. The elderly, those with compromised immune systems or other health conditions should be encouraged to exercise extreme caution about any outings, including attendance at church.
- Funerals take place from Monday to Friday
- Baptisms take place outside of Mass, on Saturday mornings.
- Meetings in parish halls or other indoor spaces are permitted in Step 3. Attendance may not exceed 50% of meeting space capacity. Participants must be masked and physically distanced. In addition, a sign-in sheet for meetings should be provided for the purposes of contact tracking. Meals and food services at meetings is discouraged at this
- Most up-to-date information is always communicated at the end of Mass. Please listen carefully.
- When leaving a message on the parish answering machine, remember to include your name and phone number.
- Local municipal by-laws remain in place - the use of face masks inside all public places is still in effect, even for those who are fully vaccinated.
