
27th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Reflection

Today's Gospel highlights the contrast between God's ways and human ways. The Pharisees ask Jesus about divorce, something that has affected many of us, whether directly or indirectly. Divorce is a common occurrence in our society. It is one of the most painful of many types of separation that can occur between two persons. It affects not only the divorced man and woman, but also their children, relatives, and friends.

God's relationship with each one of us, in contrast, is one of never-ending, complete faithfulness, revealed in the total self-gift of the Cross. God remains faithful even when we are unfaithful. His relationship with us is like an ideal marriage: he seeks to draw us into a union with himself so close that we "are no longer two, but one flesh." This love between God and an individual person overflows into the lives of others, inviting them into the communion of love, echoing Jesus' words: "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them."

Today's Gospel is not meant to be a painful reminder of the effects of divorce, which can wound us so deeply; rather, it invites us to ponder the absolute faithfulness of God's love for each one of us, a love so powerful that it brims over and touches others.

COVID-19 and Our Parish

We are happy to announce that our church is once again open for in-person celebrations. All Masses are held indoors.

- For sacramental celebrations, in Step 3, there is no capacity limit for places of worship. However, physical distancing of 2 metres is still required between parishioners attending Mass who are not from the same household.
- Livestreaming of services and dispensation from physical participation in the Sunday Eucharist continues. The elderly, those with compromised immune systems or other health conditions should be encouraged to exercise extreme caution about any outings, including attendance at church.
- Funerals take place from Monday to Friday in the morning.
- Baptisms take place outside of Mass, on Saturday mornings.
- Meetings in parish halls or other indoor spaces are permitted in Step 3. Attendance may not exceed 50% of meeting space capacity. Participants must be masked and physically distanced. In addition, a sign-in sheet for meetings should be provided for the purposes of contact tracking. Meals and food services at meetings is discouraged at this time.
- Most up-to-date information is always communicated at the end of Mass. Please listen carefully.
- When leaving a message on the parish answering machine, remember to include your name and phone number.
- Local municipal by-laws remain in place the use of face masks inside all public places is still in effect, even for those who are fully vaccinated.
