#### Reflection

When we returned months later, we found the holy water stoups were empty. Holy water - this simple life-affirming symbol – was absent. There was a void.

Amid such challenges, today's readings rekindle our hope and courage. God the Father sets the earth on its foundations so that it shall never be shaken. Likewise, he comforts and strengthens us, renewing our hope and fortitude through the Holy Spirit, a continuation of our baptism.

The faithful have depended on holy water for centuries; as St. Teresa of Avila attested, nothing compares to holy water to put devils to fight and to offer consolation for our

We know that, through baptism, Jesus was given strength to resist Satan's temptations in the desert. Like Jesus, we are strengthened for the journey by our baptism. Even if we can't always bless ourselves and our homes with holy water, let us always remember that through baptism we receive exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, fortitude, protection and hope in the Lord.

# **SACRAMENTS** AT OUR PARISH

#### **BAPTISM**

Parents who are registered members of St. Maximilian Kolbe Church and would like to baptize their child must contact the parish office at least 6 weeks before the anticipated date of baptism. Nowadays, baptisms take place on Saturday mornings, outside of Mass.

## **RECONCILIATION**

Confession takes place 30 minutes before each Mass. No registration is required. Masks are mandatory in the confessional.

# **EUCHARIST / FIRST COMMUNION CONFIRMATION**

Registration for First Communion classes (grade 2) and Confirmation classes (grade 7) takes place at the beginning of September and classes commence in October. For more information, please listen to parish announcements, read the bulletin, or check the parish website in late August/early September.

#### MARRIAGE

Couples wishing to be married at St. Maximilian Kolbe Roman Catholic Church must contact the parish office at least one year prior to the anticipated date of the wedding in order to open a wedding file and obtain a list of required documents. In addition, marriage preparation course is mandatory for all couples intending to be married in the Roman Catholic Church. Please keep in mind that our priests can only marry those who are registered members of our parish and reside within the geographical boundaries of the Archdiocese of Toronto.

#### ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Please contact the parish office if you or your loved one requite a visit from a priest.

#### R.C.I.A.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the way that a non-baptized person is brought into full communion with the Catholic Church. If you or someone you know is interested in becoming a Roman Catholic, please call the parish office for more information.

### Our Church is Open

Our church is open for in-person celebrations. All Masses are held indoors.

- Livestreaming of services and dispensation from physical participation in the Sunday Eucharist continues. The elderly, those with compromised immune systems or other health conditions should be encouraged to exercise extreme caution about any outings, including attendance at church.
- Local municipal by-laws remain in place - the use of face masks inside all public places is still in effect, even for those who are fully vaccinated.

All parish meetings have been cancelled at this time. The only exception would be those deemed as essential services, such as A.A. and AlAnon.
