
6th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Reflection

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus repeatedly overturns our comforting expectations. This Sunday, Jesus tells us that the poor, the hungry, and those who weep are blessed, but woe to those who are rich, well-fed, and laughing. "Woe to you when all speak well of you." Jesus is not laying down moral principles here; he is speaking directly to me.

This is not what I want to hear on a cold Sunday in February. The winter has been long, and I am anxious for spring to arrive. I am glad to have a warm home, good food, and good company, but I still want more. I always want more of the good things of life. But Jesus says, "You have received your consolation."

In two and a half weeks, Lent will begin. My goal for this season should be to go deeper than prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. While essential, those are externals. Rather, such practices should help me grow more deeply into Christ.

My solidarity with Jesus includes a solidarity with the poor, the hungering, and the sorrowful. Solidarity means more than a feeling of unity in my heart; it means that I, in some way, experience what the marginal ones are experiencing. Ascetic practices can nurture that experience. Better still is to have an encounter with those who suffer. Through this encounter, February will become spring. Glen Argan

Confirmation for Adults

Adults who were baptized in the Roman Catholic faith but have not received the sacrament of confirmation may contact the parish office to sign up for a short preparation course. This sacrament fully initiates an adult into the Church and is required if one wishes to act as a godparent or enter into the sacrament of marriage.

SACRAMENTS AT OUR PARISH

Parents who are registered members of St. Maximilian Kolbe Church and would like to baptize their child must contact the parish office at least 6 weeks before the anticipated date of baptism. Nowadays, baptisms take place on Saturday mornings, outside of Mass.

RECONCILIATION

Confession takes place 30 minutes before each Mass. No registration is required. Masks are mandatory in the confessional.

EUCHARIST / FIRST COMMUNION CONFIRMATION

Registration for First Communion classes (grade 2) and Confirmation classes (grade 7) takes place at the beginning of September and classes commence in October. For more information, please listen to parish announcements, read the bulletin, or check the parish website in late August/early September.

MARRIAGE

Couples wishing to be married at St. Maximilian Kolbe Roman Catholic Church must contact the parish office <u>at least one year</u> prior to the anticipated date of the wedding in order to open a wedding file and obtain a list of required documents. In addition, marriage preparation course is mandatory for all couples intending to be married in the Roman Catholic Church. Please keep in mind that our priests can only marry those who are registered members of our parish and reside within the geographical boundaries of the Archdiocese of Toronto.

Our Church is Open

• St. Maximilian Kolbe Church is open for inperson celebrations. All Masses are held indoors. • Livestreaming of services and dispensation from physical participation in the Sunday Eucharist continues. The elderly, those with compromised immune systems or other health conditions are encouraged to exercise extreme caution about any outings, including attendance at church. • Local municipal by-laws remain in place - the use of face masks inside all public places is still in effect, even for those who are fully vaccinated.

Calendar of Saints

Feb. 14th • Saints Cyril and Methodius are cometimes referred to as the Apostles of the Slavs.

Saint Valentine, officially known as Saint Valentine of Rome, is a third-century Roman saint widely celebrated on February 14 and commonly associated with "courtly love." Although not much of St. Valentine's life is reliably known, and whether or not the stories involve two different saints by the same name is also not officially decided, it is highly agreed that St. Valentine was martyred and then buried on the Via Flaminia to the north of Rome. In 1969, the Roman Catholic Church removed St. Valentine from the General Roman Calendar, because so little is known about him. However, the Church still recognizes him as a saint, listing him in the February 14 spot of Roman Martyrolgy. St. Valentine is the Patron Saint of affianced couples, beekeepers, engaged couples, epilepsy, fainting, greetings, happy marriages, love, lovers, plague, travellers, and young people. He is represented in pictures with birds and roses and his feast day is celebrated on February 14.

Feb. 17th • The Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order decided to dedicate themselves to lives of prayer and service after being inspired by visions of Our Lady.
