

Reflection

We tend to focus on what we want instead of what we need. Today's Gospel about the prodigal son is a good example of this. While he was out pursuing his interests, this younger son pursued his wants but lacked an understanding of his important needs. Our spiritual needs are fulfilled through God when we accept the unconditional love that he provides for us.

This parable reminds us that on our own we do not possess a full understanding of the benefits of God's redeeming love. When we fall short, we need to turn to God with confidence and an open heart to seek his forgiveness. When we turn to God with sorrowful and humble hearts, we experience his grace as unconditional love. Then, everything becomes new as it did for the prodigal son who returned to his welcoming at Queen of Apostles Renewal Centre. father.

How do we build on this? We need to be ambassadors for God, like the loving father in the parable who welcomed and celebrated with his son, or Jesus who ate with tax collectors and sinners and showed us the way. We can begin by looking deeply at how our words, action, and thoughts affect others and strive to be ambassadors for God, faithful to God who gave his only son to wash away our sins.

Fr. Mariusz Bosek OMI was born on January 30, 1977. in Luków Poland. After completing high school in Tychy, Poland, Fr. Mariusz began to discern his vocation. With the help of the "Oasis

Movement" in Poland, he decided to pursue a life in the priesthood and joined the Oblates of Mary Immaculate in 1996. Fr. Mariusz was ordained a priest in Obra, Poland, in 2003. After serving at St. Teresa of the Child Jesus parish in Siedlice, Poland, he was sent to the Uruguay mission. He was the only Polish Oblate to serve in the international Oblate community in Uruguay from 2005 to 2012 and his work in Uruguay revolved mainly around youth. In 2013, he was appointed assistant in the Poznan Missionary Procuracy and president of the Oblate Aid to Missions Association "Lumen Caritatis". Presently, Fr. Mariusz serves as a missionary preacher as part of the community of a parish that is being built in Opole.
