God's love for us is unlimited. Easter is the ultimate demonstration of that. So why do we sometimes limit what we can receive from God?

In Grade 8, my favourite sport was basketball and I was happily surprised to make the school team. I didn't enjoy the experience. though, because I felt I didn't know what I was doing and would be found out at any moment. Similarly, in today's Gospel, Thomas closed himself off to God's gifts.

When Jesus appeared to the disciples, they were afraid and uncertain. He brough them the comfort and sense of purpose they needed. Thomas was not present for this encounter, but he too was probably afraid and longed for reassurance. He had seen Jesus perform miracles and knew that Jesus was capable of rising from the dead. The disciples' words could have been enough for Thomas to receive the peace and purpose that Jesus wanted to give him. Instead, he chose to remain in fear and doubt for a whole week longer than everyone else.

Jesus didn't give up on Thomas. He came back just for him. This time, Thomas responded eagerly and open-heartedly. Let us have an eager and open faith and guard against fear and doubt so that we can enjoy the limitless gifts God has for us.
