

In today's Gospel, we hear these familiar words from John the Baptist: "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" During each Eucharistic celebration we hear these words and then repeat them three times – personalizing, affirming, and professing – "Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world." The triple repetition of these words is purposeful: for the emphasis, following long-standing tradition and the spiritual significance of the number three.

Can we truly believe this? Did Jesus take away the sin of the world? John the Baptist knew Jesus, and his testimony and his experience convince his listeners, including us today, that it is indeed true.

The power of such an act – taking away the sin of the world – is quite beyond comprehension. As believers we have faith that this is true. Jesus' sacrifice was for the world and for each one of us. With this knowledge of our forgiveness, we can also believe Isaiah – that the Lord formed each one of us from the womb – and pray with St. Paul that the peace of Christ can be ours. Is it any wonder that the psalmist expressed such joy in the "glad news" and such willingness to do God's will? Let us show and tell our gratitude for this good news.
