Reflection

All weeks are holy. But each year at this time the Church names one week "Holy Week" for good reason - we are invited to meditate on this last week of Jesus' life on earth.

For this occasion, Jesus chose a donkey and her colt. Apparently, he knew where the donkey lived and that the donkey had a colt. Perhaps Jesus had compassion for the mother donkey who wouldn't want to be separated from her young.

Now in those days and even today, a donkey is quite low on the list of wonderful and admired animals. Jesus must have had a good reason to choose this humble, wise animal so often ridiculed and overlooked. It might be well to spend some time reflecting on the qualities of a donkey: calm, slow, willing to carry heavy burdens, patient, said to never act out of bitterness or spite, to name a few.

The plant world is also honoured in this story. Great crowds of people spread branches on the path of Jesus. And today we, too, hold palms as the Passion narrative is told. Let us take this opportunity to reflect on the goodness and wonder of God's creation of plants and animals, and consider how they model for us graciousness and generosity, qualities that Jesus himself embodied.

- Holy Thursday -

On this day we remember the Passover feast of the Jewish people and the Last Supper of Jesus with his disciples, proceeded by the washing of the feet. This day commemorates the institution of the Eucharist and the institution of the priesthood.

- Good Friday -

The meaning of this day is clearly indicated by its name in English: it is "Good" Friday, the day when God did wonderful things for us by the suffering and death of his Son. Out of his death God has brought us light and life, making it possible for us to be saved. No Mass is celebrated on this day, but the veneration of the Cross takes place during the Liturgy.

- Holy Saturday -

On this day, the body of Jesus lay in the guarded tomb. In the Church, Holy Saturday is a quiet day, the great Sabbath rest.
