
25th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Reflection

If we look at our life, we will most likely be able to relate to the workers in today's Gospel parable. Some days we are the early workers in the vineyard: putting in the effort Please join us in praying for God's blessing to live good and holy lives, having "borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat," but seeing other people receive the same regards without putting in the same amount of work. We start comparing and get stuck in an "it's not fair" mindset. Other days, we might relate more to the workers who started late: we realize the Lord blessed us when we least deserve it, and we are made aware of God's merciful nature.

We live in a culture that focuses heavily on rewards. And we sometimes apply this to our relationship with God: do a certain work, receive certain blessings. But God's ways are not our ways, and his thoughts are above our thoughts.

The Father's heart is full of compassion: he sees us waiting, he sees us struggling to find our place. He knows we're worried, and he's aware of the burdens we are carrying. The Lord has called us to work in his vineyard. What a privilege it is to have been chosen! Isn't being chosen by the Lord a reward in itself? Take a moment to thank the Father for choosing you today.

Mass Intentions for 2024

Mass intentions for 2024 can be requested in person, in the parish hall on Wednesday, Kolbe ProLife Group invites all parishioners, September 27 from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. Each family/household can order one Sunday Mass and two weekday Masses (pending availability).

When a priest offers Holy Mass, he has three intentions: First, to offer the Mass reverently and validly in accord with the norms of the Church. Second, to offer the Mass in union with the whole Church and for the good of the whole Church. *Third*, to offer the Mass for a particular intention, such as the repose of the soul of someone who has died, or in thanksgiving for graces received.

By requesting Mass intentions for people close to us, we offer them a beautiful spiritual gift. By actively participating in this Mass and receiving Holy Communion in their intention, we add to this spiritual gift.

How to draft Mass intentions?

God knows the desire of our heart, so there is no need to explain to Him at length what we are praying for. Intentions should be short and concise, if only for practical reasons. The Holy Mass is not about listening to people's stories.

When drafting intentions:

• Make them concise and specific • Use proper names (ex. Andrew, not Andy) • Avoid professional titles • Do not combine intentions for the dead with intentions for the living • Do not include details regarding intimate, very personal or family matters.

Examples of intentions:

• In thanksgiving for a successful surgery • In thanksgiving for 20 years of marriage of (names) • For God's blessing for the (surname) family • For a successful surgery and health for (name) • For God's blessing for (name) on his/her birthday • For God's help in overcoming addition • For the late (name) • For the deceased members of the (surname) family.
