

Reflection

Today's Gospel tells of the wise men journeying to meet the infant king. We are told they were following a star and when they found Jesus, they rejoiced and responded with worship and gifts. We can do the same in our lives.

We must notice the star – the call from God that beckons us - and respond as they did. These wise men no doubt had busy and demanding lives, but they dropped everything and followed a star to something, to someone, beyond their imagining. At the beginning, they could not have known what the journey would hold for them, only that they should follow wholeheartedly. They must have made space in their hearts, to respond so fully. In the season of Advent, we were called to make space for Jesus to come. Not that Jesus was not already present, but to brush away the clutter and make space again for what – for who – is most important.

Once Jesus has arrived in the space we have made in our hearts, how do we respond to his arrival? To this new awareness? Are we overwhelmed with joy as the wise men were? Can we too respond by sharing our time, out attentive presence, and our gifts? What is God calling us to do and to share? Can we respond as the wise men did, with hope and without reservation?

The Epiphany of Our Lord

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Epiphany. "The Lord and ruler is coming; kingship is his, and government and power." With these words, the Church proclaims that today's feast brings to a perfect fulfillment all the purposes of Advent. Epiphany, therefore, marks the liturgical zenith of the Advent-Christmas season. - Pius Parsch

The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek epiphainen, a verb that means "to shine upon," "to manifest," or "to make known." Thus, the feast of the Epiphany celebrates the many ways that Christ has made Himself known to the world, mainly the three events that manifested the mission and divinity of Christ: the visit of the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12). the baptism of Jesus (Mark 1:9-11), and the miracle at Cana (John 2:1-11).

K+M+B 2024

Today we bless incense and chalk. After returning home from the church, we use the chalk to mark the door of our home with the initials of the names of the Wise Men and the year 2024.

You may also write C + M + B(Christus Mansoni Benedicat) which means "May Christ bless this house."

The letters on the door are a visible sign that a Christian family lives in the house.
