John the Baptist is a perennially challenging and important figure in salvation history. Luke's opening verse situates John's call in a context that includes some of the very men who are threatened by and opposed to both John and Jesus. In this time marked by Roman occupation and socio-economic injustice, the word of God comes to John: a prophet who prepares the way for God's impending intervention in human history.

The renewal that John proclaims has broadranging personal and social implications. His baptism of repentance is meant to be an outward sign of metanoia or conversion, a radical transformation - grounded in the experience of God's love and forgiveness that finds expression in commitment to the common good.

As Christians, we naturally associate the new liberation from sin and suffering that John proclaims with the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. John's message – his call to repentance in the face of immanent judgment - would have been disturbing back then, but perhaps we need to hear it even more today. His ministry challenges us this Advent season to embrace the radical nature of our baptismal calling to repent and believe in the Good News - to witness to and prepare the way for the renewal of all creation that we associate with Christ's return.

In the 13th century, great thinkers such as St. Bernard and St. Thomas Aguinas debated whether Mary could have been born without original sin if, as St. Paul says, all persons are born in sin (Romans 5.12). By the 19th century, the theological debate was resolved and in 1854 Pius IX defined the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception as a dogma of faith.

Each year on December 8th, Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate celebrate their Feast Day. On this special day, we remember and pray for all Oblate Fathers and lay associates who serve in various ministries. We wish them an abundance of God's grace and continued protection of Mary Immaculate, their patroness.
