Reflection

Some 50 years ago, I had a profound spiritual awakening. Being touched by the Holy Spirit in such a real and deep manner compelled me to enthusiastically go and share the experience with everyone. In today's Gospel we are privileged to witness just such a movement of the Spirit in the lives of Mary and Elizabeth.

Luke gives us an insight into the heart and person of Mary: prompted by the Spirit, she unselfishly forgets her own needs and visits her joy, and God's unending love. Merry cousin who has miraculously conceived in her *Christmas to all parishioners and guests!* old age. Mary did not think twice, but in haste took the arduous journey to share the joy of her own impending motherhood. We are also given a glimpse of the Spirit at work in the heart of Elizabeth who cannot contain her joy but must bestow blessings upon her younger cousin.

This Gospel invites us to journey with Mary into the Judean hill country – a journey that will continue with Joseph to Nazareth, in flight after the Nativity and ultimately to the Cross. When our own journey is challenging, we can take heart from Mary. She followed the Promptings of the Spirit, found the strength to carry out her journey and received blessings in return.

In this holy season, may the intercession of Mary and the saints give us a deeper intimacy with the Holy Family.

- SACRAMENTS -- AT OUR PARISH -

•A hospital chaplain – a Roman Catholic priest – is employed full-time at local hospitals and is on-call 24 hours a day. To arrange a **hospital visit**, please ask a nurse to call the priest on duty. •Please contact the parish office if you or your loved one requite a home visit from a priest.

Parents who are registered members of St. Maximilian Kolbe Church and would like to baptize their child must contact the parish office at least six weeks before the anticipated date of baptism. Preparation course is mandatory for all parents and Godparents. Baptisms take place during Mass:

• on Saturday at 5 p.m. in English • on Sunday at 2:30 p.m. in Polish

Godparents must meet all requirements outlined in Canon 874, paragraph 1:

• be at least 16 years old

• be fully initiated into the Catholic Church • be in good standing with the Church (not married outside of the Church and not

cohabitating)

Couples wishing to be married at St. Maximilian Kolbe Roman Catholic Church must contact the parish office at least one year prior to the anticipated date of the wedding in order to open a wedding file and obtain a list of required documents. In addition, marriage preparation course is mandatory for all couples. Please keep in mind that our priests can only officiate at marriage ceremonies of registered members of our parish who reside within the geographical boundaries of the Archdiocese of Toronto.
