Reflection

In previous decades there was an annual pre-Christmas thrill for generations of children, particularly those of us within a rural setting. The arrival of the Sears Wish Book was an occasion of great joy. Many hours were spent pouring over its pages and formulating a wish list, mental or otherwise, of what to ask Santa to bring.

In today's Gospel Jesus encourages us to ask, to search, to knock. In turn we are assured that we will receive, we will find, and we will have the way opened to us. That said, this exhortation to have confidence in prayer concludes with an expectation of what – or rather who -we ought to be asking for: the Person of the Holy Spirit! "If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"

God is a gift-giver. He wants to give us, his children, the best, which is his very self. In fact, this is one of the names of the Holy Spirit – the Gift of God. During our eucharistic celebration let us thank God for the gift of the Holy Spirit. May we also prepare our hearts with joyful expectation for more of the Spirit, whom the Father will send to all who ask.
