Luke 13.22-30

As a child, I used to play hide-and-seek with my young cousins. Being an older cousin, I was amazed at the places where the younger ones were able to hide. My mind wandered back to those memories while meditating on Jesus' words: "Strive to enter through the narrow door."

I think of my small cousins hiding in narrow spaces and wonder if being childlike could be a key to entering through this much-desired door. Children trust and depend greatly on their parents, and don't carry heavy burdens. These burdens can be unhealthy attachments to earthly things, or sinful lifestyles. Letting go of these burdens is a necessary step to entering the kingdom of God.

The second reading also relates to children and teaches us that part of God's fatherly love includes discipline. Discipline can be seen as our training to enter through the narrow door; it helps us develop holy habits, forming an obedient heart that is open and responsive to the promptings of the Father.

We are invited today to examine our hearts: What baggage should we be leaving behind as we approach the Lord today? Leave it at the foot of the cross, and give the Lord permission to guide you, so that you may one day be able to enter through the narrow door and take part in his heavenly banquet.
