Reflection

The teachings of Jesus overflow with direction that can seem almost impossible to live by. “Let go and let God” is one particularly difficult lesson, given our inclination to take control of any personal situation. Often we only turn to God for help in dire straits and when we have dug a hole too deep for us to escape independently.

The Baptism of the Lord narrative is a straightforward message about letting go and letting God, in any circumstance. John the Baptist feels unworthy to baptize Jesus and says he should be baptized by Jesus instead. Jesus answers: “Let it be so now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness.”

Fulfilling all righteousness is living God’s will. The baptism of a sinless Jesus reveals his human side and his desire to be right with God, all the while foreshadowing his mortal death on the cross in atonement for the sins of humanity.

In his humanity, Jesus later questions God’s will by asking if death on the cross could be avoided, similar to the way we seek alternative solutions to those offered by God. Jesus acquiesced to God’s will, showing us how to seek and pray for God’s help in the most trying of times. In doing so, we too are the beloved with whom God is well pleased.

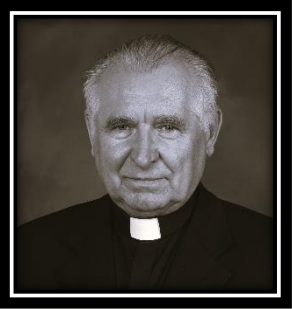
Anointing of the Sick

– IN MEMORIAM –

Fr. Jan Sadowski OMI

October 23, 1937 – January 3, 2026



Fr. Jan Sadowski OMI was born on October 23, 1937, in Rawa Mazowiecka, Poland. He completed his elementary and secondary education in his hometown before entering theological studies in Warsaw. From 1954 to 1959, he studied philosophy and theology at the Major Seminary in Warsaw, while also attending the Faculty of Theology at the Catholic Academy.

He was ordained on June 26, 1960, in Warsaw and following his ordination ministered in Kolbiel, Łomianki, Poświętne, Piastów, and Wysokienice. In 1970, Fr. Sadowski entered the novitiate of the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate at Święty Krzyż and made his perpetual vows on July 28, 1973, in Lubliniec, formally committing his life to the Oblate charism.

As an Oblate, he continued his pastoral ministry in Gorzów Wielkopolski, Lubliniec, and Wrocław. In 1980, he undertook further studies in Paris, France. That same year marked the beginning of a major chapter in his missionary life, when Fr. Sadowski was sent to Madagascar where he remained until 1993. He contributed significantly to the early development of the Oblate mission on the island.

Upon returning to Europe, Fr. Sadowski ministered briefly in Poland and in France. In 1997, he was assigned to Canada, where he served as associate pastor at St. Hyacinth Parish in Ottawa, and later at St. Casimir’s Parish in Toronto where he remained until his full retirement, at which time he transferred to Copernicus Lodge.

Having lived 88 years of life, 65 years of priesthood, and 54 years of religious life, Fr. Jan Sadowski OMI, passed away peacefully at 3:10 a.m. on January 3, 2026, at St. Joseph’s Hospital in Toronto.
